The AHS team will support in the implementation and running of the Aboriginal Head start (AHS) program which is a family-centered program designed to meet the individual needs of children and families physically, cognitively, spiritually, emotionally, and intellectually. The Head Start program has been designed, developed and implemented around 7 components: Health, Nutrition, Parent and Family Involvement, Coast Salish structure and Hul q'umi'num language, Social Support, Education and Special Needs. You will be a member of an interdisciplinary team of early childhood professionals, working collaboratively to support the Early Childhood department and the families of the Cowichan Valley.

We provide children and families opportunities to enjoy nutritious snacks and meals, activities, circle, culture and language, and fieldtrips. This is a family participation program.
