PRIMARY ACCOUNTABILITY:

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Supervise the completion of all documentation required by parents visiting the centre
- Adhere to agency child-minding policies, particularly the Behaviour Policy and Emergency Procedures
- Be fully compliant at all times with Child Care Licensing Regulations
- Provide supportive, fun, mature child-minding services to children aged 6 weeks to 6 years on a drop in basis

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS

Adhere to all elements of Vancouver Island Health Authority Child Care Licensing Regulation, Community Care and Assisted Living Act:

- be at least 19 years of age;
- have completed a course, or a combination of courses, of at least 20 hours duration in child development, guidance, health and safety, or nutrition, with proof of coursework
- have relevant work experience
- provide a clear criminal record check provided by the Ministry of Justice
- provide a Physician's Waiver stating mental and physical readiness to work with children
- provide 3 references

ASSET QUALIFICATIONS

- Cross-culturally aware and able to engage with people from diverse ethnic, cultural and religious backgrounds
- Sensitivity to issues of immigration and knowledge of adjustment and transitional issues specific to newcomers
- Second and third languages are beneficial
