How It Works

Pacific Rim is a distance education institution that offers all its courses entirely online with a required on-site practicum component for certificate programs. Students regularly communicate with instructors and support staff via email and phone regarding course work and assignments. At the end of the course, students must write an examination online (for eligible students that meet the technical and academic requirements) or on-site under the supervision of a proctor in their community.

Admission Requirements

Students are required to submit:

- · online admission interview questionnaire
- an official high school transcript with proof of Grade 12 English completion (or equivalent)
- two character reference letters (on a template provided)
- · Photo Identification
- a valid Criminal Record Check with a vulnerable sector check
- a Declaration of Health form (provided)

In addition, students must have access to a computer with Internet, MS Word, Acrobat Reader and a personal email account. Prior to starting the full program, students must be 19 years of age.

Students become eligible to apply for Early Childhood Educator Assistant (ECEA)
Certification through the BC ECE Registry upon successful completion of one of the first three courses in the Basic Early
Childhood Education Certificate program.



Basic Early Childhood Educator Certificate

This program provides training for individuals to work in licensed facilities that care for children aged 3 to 5 years. It consists of 8 courses and 3 practicums. Areas covered include the following aspects of child care: health, safety, nutrition, growth, and development. Also included are foundations in early childhood education, developmentally appropriate curriculum, and interpersonal communication. Through the practicums, students learn how theory studied in the courses relates to practice.

- Health, Safety, and Nutrition (ECE 111)
- Child Growth and Development (ECE 112)
- Guiding and Caring (ECE 113)
- Practicum I Observing and Recording (ECE 191)
- Foundations in Early Childhood Education (ECE 114)
- ECE Curriculum I (ECE 115)
- ECE Curriculum II (ECE 116)
- ECE Curriculum III (ECE 117)
- Interpersonal Communication (ECE 118)
- Practicum II (ECE 192)
- Practicum III (ECE 193)

Post-Basic Infant/Toddler Educator Certificate

This program focuses on growth and development in the first three years of a child's life as well as safety of children under the age of three. It includes appropriate curriculum for this age group, relationships with the families of the children, theories related to infant growth and development, and administering an Infant/Toddler Centre.

Graduates of the Infant Toddler/Educator Certificate
Program become eligible to apply for Infant Toddler
Educator (ITE) Certification through the BC ECE Registry.

Educator Certificate

This program is designed to provide the skills necessary to work with children who need extra support in a child care setting. Courses cover the following topics: benefits of inclusion, effects of a disability on the child and family, intervention strategies, and early intervention. Courses will also discuss strategies for early childhood educators to maximize the potential of children with extra support needs.

- Infant/Toddler Growth and Development (ECE 211)
- Working with Families (ECE 212)
- Centre Administration (ECE 213)
- Inclusion in Early Childhood Settings Part I (ECE 234)
- Inclusion in Early Childhood Settings Part II (ECE 235)
- Practicum Inclusion in Early Childhood Settings (ECE 292)

This program has been approved by the Private Training Institutions Regulatory Unit (PTIRU) of the Ministry of Post-Secondary Education and Future Skills and graduates become eligible to apply for Special Needs Educator (SNE) Certification through the BC ECE Registry.

Early Childhood Educator Diploma

Students who complete all three certificate programs (Basic, Infant/Toddler and Special Needs) will receive the Early Childhood Education Diploma and be eligible to apply for Early Childhood Educator (ECE) Certification, Infant Toddler Educator (ITE) Certification, and Special Needs Educator (SNE) Certification through the BC ECE Registry.
